Earth Hour Events in Kurdistan

On 28 March 2015 Kurdistan joined the global environmental movement Earth Hour event, which was organized by the Green Environment Organization and was sponsored by Lafarge Iraq. The aim of this activity in Kurdistan is to tell the global community that Kurdistan protects its nature and that they are part of the global movement to address climate change. Their mission was to connect the Kurdistan people with global efforts to take action to address climate change. This important environmental day is celebrated in 172 countries. Two activities took place in the morning and

evening to reflect the core goals of the event.

The first activity was a tree planting at a refugee's camp to encourage greening of the camp. A total of 70 trees were planted in the kindergarten and the primary school. The event was attended by Lafarge employees, the General Director of Environment Department at Nature Iraq, Waterkeepers Iraq, media outlets and the camp management team.

The second event took place in the courtyard of the governorate building where the Governor of Sulaimani, Lafarge employees, local government staff and NGOs representatives gathered. The electric power was cut off for
